Geometry Assist wizard for the Epson Projector Professional Tool is now available even when the input video aspect ratio is 16:9.

Previous version (Version 1.00)

- Stacking

Overshoot Light (Camera Assist V150)

Epson Projector Professional Tool's **Geometry Assist** wizard now supports overshoot light.

The projected images can be automatically adjusted even when the projected image extends onto the wall adjacent to the wall of the target projection area.

Unrestricted Use of 100 V Power Cord (for EB-PQ2216 and EB-PQ2220)

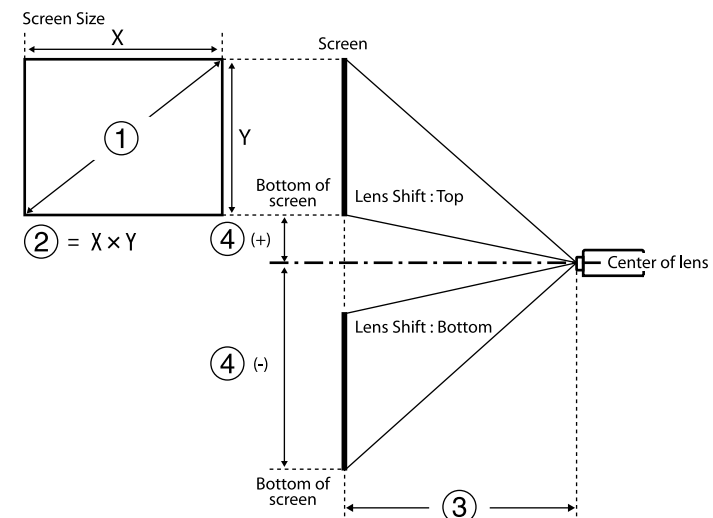
For the EB-PQ2216 and EB-PQ2220, the following restrictions do not apply when using a 100 V power cord.

- The maximum brightness is limited.
- Light Source Mode, Estimated Remains, Refresh Mode, and Light Source Calibration functions cannot be used.

Note on the Monitor Password

The Monitor Password is useful for monitoring projectors with a switcher and a system controller, or when using Epson Projector Management ver.5.30 or earlier.



- The Monitor Password can only be set when **Compatible** is selected for Command Communication.
- When setting the Monitor Password, use the same password as the one used for the switcher and the system controller.

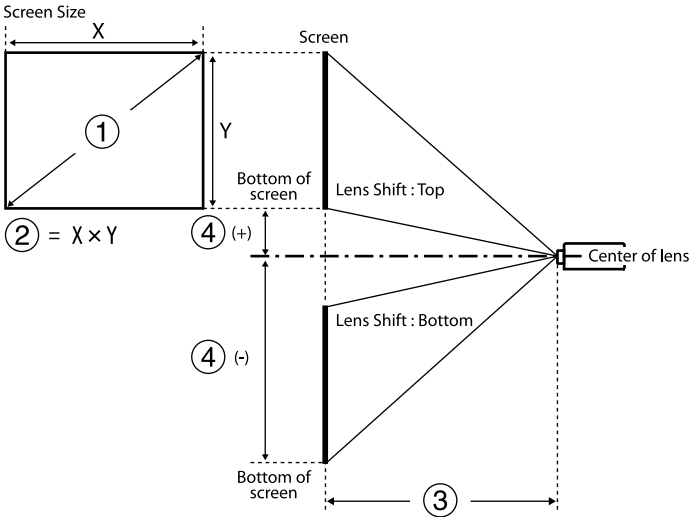

Projection surface types for the Geometry Assist - Stacking Function in the Epson Projector Professional Tool have been added and improved.

- **Complex** has been added to the projection surface types for stacking (Camera Assist V200). Select **Complex** when projecting onto building walls or similar surfaces.
- We have improved installation and operation for all projection surface types.
 - You can perform with a single camera (connected to the projector set as layer 1)
 - You can mount an external camera on a tripod instead of a dedicated mount, allowing you to install the camera where you like.
 - You can set the camera's capture range to avoid automatic adjustment failures.
 - You can set the projection range of the special pattern displayed during automatic adjustment to avoid automatic adjustment failures.
